Running a business and surf instructing is **super rewarding** for me. I get to share what I love with others. And my office is mostly in the ocean.



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

That **passion** is what will help you have a career that you really enjoy. Getting a qualification that allows you to teach that passion can get you work all over the world.








#### What is one of the most challenging things about your career?
