

















### Graphic Approach Circular Rationale

John O'Groats - 'Known as the most northerly point of the UK'. We could build on the 'O' - which is also a good visual reference to waterwheel

The John O'Groats Mill is unique in Caithness in having all its internal machinery in tact and was the last water powered mill to be built in the county, if not the country. A 'circular form' is highly visible both inside and out - from the water wheel itself, to the various cogs and grinding stones used to manufacture the flour.

This circular form, is also within the name John O'Groats, and given this location is highly recognisable as a destination in its own right, the 'O' is a lovely link between location and the mill.















Overlapping 'Os' create bere graphic shapes that can be used around the site as part of the graphic approach. 'Bere' is the local word for Barley.
